New Business:

Next month is our annual meeting and election: Claudia, Colleen, Randy and Benay are up for re-election: Colleen is willing to stay on, but if someone else is chomping at the bit to be on the board, she would step down. Shawn Guiney, new homeowner (bought Baron’s house) was treasurer of a slightly larger subdivision HOA for seven years, and he might be interested. Christy will invite him to next month’s meeting.

Public Comments: Angela Buckley texted to complain that cars drive too fast in the dark mornings when homeowners are out walking. She was almost hit and she was on the grass, wearing reflective clothing. Pam Gall emailed to complain about kids racing golf carts. These are problems we have not been able to solve, despite one crash a few years ago with injury. Traffic problems are beyond our jurisdiction. Pam suggested we change our covenants to require registration of golf carts. Dave Tutt suggested the same thing. I will put that on our wish list of things to change the next time we rewrite our covenants. It would require spending money on a lawyer and a vote of the homeowners to make this change.

Minutes of 10-6-25: Randy moved we approve the minutes. Benay seconded; motion carried.

Treasurer's report approval: Christy moved we approve the October treasurer's report. Dawn seconded; motion carried.

Old Business:

Toys for Tots – Claudia was not here

Christmas Decorating Contest – Colleen was not here

Bids for landscaping entrances – Dawn had two bids, one from Fence Pro and one from Art's Landscaping. Tholens hasn't gotten back to her yet, so we'll wait to see that third bid. These proposals clean up the brickwork, take out the existing plants, and plant new plants. The birches on the north Pipeline Road entrance are raining sticks, and the homeowners are piling more sticks from other trees behind the River Bend sign for us to remove. Both landscapers advised us to take out those birches before they fall, so the bids include the cost of removing those trees. We can then shrink the footprint of the landscaping around our signs on the two Pipeline Road entrances by moving the rear edging forward closer to the backs of the signs. Tim said there's a new kind of edging that makes it easier to mow along; we can ask about that. We agreed that Art's Landscaping's bid included too many plants, it looks crowded. We should decide before January on a plan and a contractor so the work can be done in the spring. Dawn will send us more information and we can vote by email.

Dusty Redmon trim trees looking south on Pipeline Road? – Tim talked to him and he said he would trim those trees, but he hasn't yet. We saw someone trimming trees on Pipeline by the south cut of River Bend. Tim will call the county.

Any news on the 113 website? – Christy hadn't looked at this before the meeting, but while writing these minutes, found that the website has not been updated. Projected completion is still listed as 2024. The project runs from Edgewater to Indian Trail. 113 west of Edgewater has been resurfaced. The website is <https://www.il113kankakeecounty.org/>

New Business:

Budget Approval: Randy presented a document comparing what we've spent across the last five years. He used this to project our costs for 2026, which includes \$9K for landscaping the signs. We'll cap the cost of lawn care at \$3540, so Jackson should plan accordingly. We still have \$6K in savings and don't imagine we'll be able to add to it this year. Benay moved we approve the budget. Christy seconded, motion carried.

Dave Baron's house was bought by Cheryl and Henry Matson, Tom Matson's parents.

We will not hold a meeting in December.

New Business:

Bees at the park: Scott Styck took care of it. It was a big underground nest that required him to truck in dirt. He's still on the board of the Park District even though he has moved to Bonfield.

Dawn is working on getting bids for landscaping the two entrances on Pipeline Road. Randy will incorporate that into the budget.

We'll hold a Christmas decorating contest again this year. Colleen will volunteer to take the pictures. People in the South Cut participated last year as well. If one of them wins, Colleen and Christy will buy the prize for them, so that the HOA prize basket goes to a member of the HOA.

We'll collect Toys for Tots for Christmas, in cooperation with our firemen or sheriff's department. Claudia will coordinate that again.

Benay learned that the project to resurface Route 113 from Edgewater to Indian Trail is in the planning stage. According to their website, there will be a public meeting. They may include pedestrian, bicycle, and/or turn lane! Il113kankakeecounty.org is the website.

Old Business:

Jamie O'Connor new signs: He has been paid, signs are up and look great. Thanks to Benay for all her work on this project!

Garage sale reflection: Reviews were mixed. We had more people Thursday than Friday or Saturday, maybe because of the competition of Bradley and Bourbonnais garage sales listed in the paper, for sales Friday and Saturday. New Business:

Easement: Someone apparently sprayed an herbicide on the easement behind our detention pond adjacent to Scanlon's property. We'll all look at it between now and next month, and talk more then.

Derek Ryan approached Dawn about the trees on his property along Pipeline Road. He wondered if the HOA would trim them. Dawn contacted the county to see whose responsibility it is to maintain that easement. Steve Marion of the Kankakee County board said that maintenance of the easement is the responsibility of the property owner. The HOA is not responsible. Christy will send Mr. Ryan a letter saying that Dawn brought this to the group, that the property belongs to him and he is responsible for maintenance, and if he thinks the dangling branches obstruct the view, he could call Dusty Redmond, Limestone Township Road District at (815) 939-1636 to see if the township would trim them. The easement is for the pipeline.

Tim will ask Dusty when our subdivision roads will be resurfaced.

Benay will call the number of the guy who knew when Route 113 will be resurfaced. He had said he'd let us know when the open comment period started so we could vote on line to extend the road to three lanes.

2. Doesn't every home have to have a lamppost? Those who don't are in the south cut. No one enforces the covenants there. Why not? They didn't form an HOA and we didn't decide to take on that responsibility.
3. Someone built an ugly wooden fence. Is that allowed? We approve fences, the material is not restricted.
4. Are they going to do something with the river lot? That is our property, we have no money right now, having spent it on the signs, but we have kicked some ideas around.

Minutes approval: Benay moved we approve the minutes of 4-7-25. Claudia seconded, motion carried.

We did not have a quorum for our meeting 5-5-25, Christy took notes instead of minutes.

Treasurer's report approval: Christy moved we approve the treasurer's report. Benay seconded; motion carried.

Old Business:

Her account had accidentally been credited Vern Love's payment. Vern was billed for late dues, then patiently proved that he had paid. Christy apologized to Ronda and told her that she would be charged the \$150 plus \$25 late fee plus plus \$28 (\$1 a day through April 30) for a total of \$203. Ronda asked if we could waive the late fee, since she had never paid late before, and she never got any emails from us. Christy proved she had sent emails, and told Ronda if she wanted to ask the board to waive the fees she could come to the board meeting. She did not. So Benay moved, Dawn seconded that Christy email Ronda to say the \$1 a day starts again June 3rd, up to \$250. Motion carried. If she doesn't pay this year, we'll bill her for it again next year. They did mow their lawn after we sent a letter.

[Hot Rod Power Tour](#) June 10th Carol Keller told Christy that 6000 cars will be coming from Indianapolis to Joliet for this event. Their route takes them on Route 113, so this may cause a traffic disruption around 11:00 am and a free car show from our river lot. Christy will email a heads up to the homeowners.

Lot 007 2880 Stone Ridge Drive has a new privacy fence. The board did not approve the plan for this fence. We don't know how or whether a permit was issued.

New Business:

Bids for mowing? Or shall we continue Jaxon Joiner? Need Cert of Insurance Jaxon Joiner submitted a bid that is \$10 higher than last year: \$80 per mowing. Dawn is volunteering to do the weeding so we don't need him to do that. If Dawn finds she needs him, we'll ask him to do it. Randy moved that we accept Joiner's bid for mowing, not cleanup of entrances. Benay seconded; motion carried. He is also interested in submitting a bid to re-do the landscaping at the two Pipeline Road entrances. We should generate specifications, then get bids from Art's, Tholens and Joiner.

Set date for garage sale: June 5-6-7.

Set date for Easter Egg Hunt: April 12th, with a rain date of 4-19. Christy will inform homeowners with the next dues reminder to be sent 3-17-25.

Minutes of 1-6-25 approval: Randy moved we approve the minutes. Benay seconded, motion carried.

Treasurer's report of January approval: Christy moved we approve the treasurer's report. Colleen seconded; motion carried.

Old Business:

Jamie O'Connor appeared via FaceTime for Sign replacement. Benay showed us a sample of the foam he will use. We asked: How long will it last? He said probably 20 years. He did not specify a warranty. He said it might need paint to be touched up in 7-8 years. The foam is HDU (high density urethane) and is UV-stable. He'll back the sign with a stabilizing aluminum-sandwich which is covered with enamel so we don't need to paint it. It will be the same size (120" x 44" x 2") as the existing sign on the north (River Bend Drive) using the same paint as the sign on Valley View drive.

Jamie needs four weeks of lead time to do it. He won't paint it on site, he'll bring it painted and mount it using existing brackets. We will have the rocks powerwashed by Grossbusters before he puts up the sign. Last March Grossbusters power washed the stone supports for the big sign on Valley View for \$325. Christy will send the color numbers to Benay and ask Grossbusters for a bid and see how soon he could clean both sets of stone. Jamie wants half down and the rest upon completion. He said it's easier for him to do both signs at once, so we'll use our budgeted \$6500 and borrow from savings to pay $\$5325 \times 2 = \$10,650$ for these two signs. Next year we'll pay back savings and spend money on the landscaping around the signs. After Christy hears from Grossbusters, Benay will call Jamie O'Connor with color numbers and ask him to submit a new proposal for two signs, saying we will pay half down and half upon completion. She'll tell him about when Grossbusters can get the job done before the signs go up. Jamie will give us the leftover paint so we can touch up the signs as needed. The new signs should not be pressure washed because the foam could be deformed by the water.

Letter was sent to Lot 84 regarding barking dog and the situation has improved.

Conflicting ordinances re street parking: Limestone Township and County. The truck that was parked on the road for weeks is gone now.

New Business:

Dawn Tutt has been elected to our board, replacing Jeff Souligne. We signed a card to thank Jeff. We had a great response to our ballot this year with no write in votes.

Tim agreed to continue as president, Christy agreed to continue as secretary, and they were both elected by the board.

Dues will be \$150 again this year. Bills for dues will be sent out February 24th, March 10, and again March 24th. People who haven't paid yet will get another email on March 30th, and people who still don't pay their dues will receive an email showing they owe a late fee of \$25 on April 2. Holms will be reminded that they owe us \$25 from last year.

Claudia moved, Benay seconded that we adjourn at 7:25. Motion carried.
